Penny has continued to crochet blankets using chunky donated wool that we are unable to use for the squares, in order to support those in need locally. She has been able to donate these to The Dementia Ward at Mount Gould, The Soup Run, The Jasmine Mother's Recovery Centre at Trevi, and the Garage Project in Union Street. (Supporting the homeless). This brings her total of blankets donated so far to an amazing 250!



Donations of wool have continued to come in for which we are so grateful. Nothing is wasted!

Don't these pictures make it all worthwhile? We hope they inspire you and bring you joy! Remember every square counts! (And handwarmers and hats!) We can never express enough how much we value each one of you and are so grateful for all you do. It would not happen without you!

#### Some tips to remember:

- Every square MUST be as close to 8 inches as possible or they will not join up with the others correctly.
- Please remember to sew in all ends and leave a 20" length of yarn when casting off. If possible, please butterfly as shown using contrasting yarn.
